

percent of those who use marijuana may have some degree of marijuana use disorder, ³ meaning they have a very serious marijuana problem.

People are dying on Georgia's highways as a result of THC intoxication, but we don't hear about it because THC levels are very rarely measured in an impaired or deceased driver's blood. In 2016 only 15 out of 460,000 crashes in Georgia were officially related to marijuana.⁵
