


Suicide in Georgia


1,659 deaths GA ranked 34th in suicide deaths in the US 2020. The age-adjusted rate of suicide deaths in Georgia is lower than the rate for rest of the South, but higher than the national rate for the United States. In 2021, 1,659 lives were lost in Georgia due to suicide. The 1,659 deaths equate to 50,703 years of potential life lost. There were no recorded suicide deaths among children ages 0-7 years old.

MEANS OF DEATH

Firearms are the most common means of suicide death followed by suffocation, drug poisoning, and other means. Males and females utilize suffocation at similar frequencies. Females use drug poisoning and other means more than males, and males use firearms more than females (Georgia Violent Death Reporting System, 2020).



DEMOGRAPHICS


Suicide death rates are highest among people older than 22. However, suicide is the leading cause of death for youth ages 10-14.

Males account for 79% of suicide deaths while females account for 21%.

Suicide deaths are most common among white people followed by black American or African people, Asian people. and those who are multiracial.






413 deaths Region 1 had 413 suicide deaths in 2021. These deaths equate to 12,364 years of potential life lost. Compared to other regions, Region 1 had the highest suicide rate among those who are ages 18-24 years old. Region 1 had the lowest suicide death rate among males. There were no deaths among Indigenous people, Pacific Islanders, or multiracial people.






238 deaths Region 2 had 238 suicide deaths in 2021. These deaths equate to 7,341 years of potential life lost. Compared to other regions, Region 2 had the highest rate of suicide deaths among Asian people. Region 2 had the highest suicide death rate among those 45-64 years old. Region 2 had no suicide deaths among Indigenous people or Pacific Islanders. There were fewer than 4 deaths among multiracial people.






452 deaths Region 3 had 452 suicide deaths in 2021. This equates to 14,534 years of potential life lost. Compared to other regions, Region 3 had the lowest death rate among white people and the highest death rate among black or African American people. Region 3 had the lowest death rate among those 45 years and older. Region 3 also had the lowest death rates for people who aren't Hispanic.






102 deaths Region 4 had 102 suicide deaths in 2021. This equates to 2,944 years of potential life lost. Region 4 had no deaths among Indigenous people, Pacific Islanders, and people who are multiracial. There were less than 4 deaths among Asian people. Compared to other regions, Region 4 had the highest death rate among those ages 10-17 years old, but the lowest death rate among people 18-24 years old. Region 4 had the highest suicide death rate among Hispanic people.







Region 5 had the highest suicide death rate among people 25-64 years old and females. There were fewer than 4 deaths among Asian people and people who are multiracial. There were no deaths among Indigenous people and Pacific Islanders.






237 deaths Region 6 had 237 suicide deaths in 2021, which equates to 6,567 years of potential life lost. Compared to other regions, Region 6 had the highest death rate among people 65 years and older, but the lowest death rate among those 10-17 years old. Region 6 also had the lowest death rates for black or African American people. There were fewer than 4 deaths among Asian people and people who are multiracial. There were no deaths among Indigenous people or Pacific Islanders.


